We are delighted to inform you that the Scottish Institute of Human Relations is again offering the Workshop Clinical Conversations.

Clinical Conversations is structured around two clinical presentations, one from a child psychotherapist, and the other from an adult psychotherapist, each lasting an hour and a half. It is an opportunity for each presenter to be 'in conversation' with a senior practitioner/clinician which eventually opens up to include all participants. Its purpose is to enable child and adult psychotherapists and counsellors to learn about each other's work and to deepen their thinking about clinical practice and related theoretical issues.

Angela Joyce is a Training and Supervising Analyst of the British Psychoanalytical Society and works in private practice in London. She trained as a child analyst at the Anna Freud Centre where, for the past 14 years, she has worked on a pioneering application of psychoanalysis to the treatment of infants and their parents: the Parent Infant Project. In 2005 she co-authored with that team *An Introduction to the Practice of Psychoanalytic Parent Infant Psychotherapy: Claiming the Baby*, T. Baradon et al; (Routledge) and in 2009 contributed to *Relational Trauma in Infancy* edited by Tessa Baradon (Routledge). She also currently jointly leads the Child Psychotherapy service at The Anna Freud Centre.

Angela is an honorary lecturer at University College London. She is Deputy Director of the Squiggle Foundation and an editor with the Winnicott Trust. She lectures and teaches widely and has written papers and contributed to books on early development: In 2005 *Human Development: An Introduction to the Psychodynamics of Growth, Maturity and Ageing*: Eric Rayner et al 4th Edition. This year she edited with Lesley Caldwell "*Reading Winnicott*" which was published in the New Library of Psychoanalysis Teaching Series in January 2011.

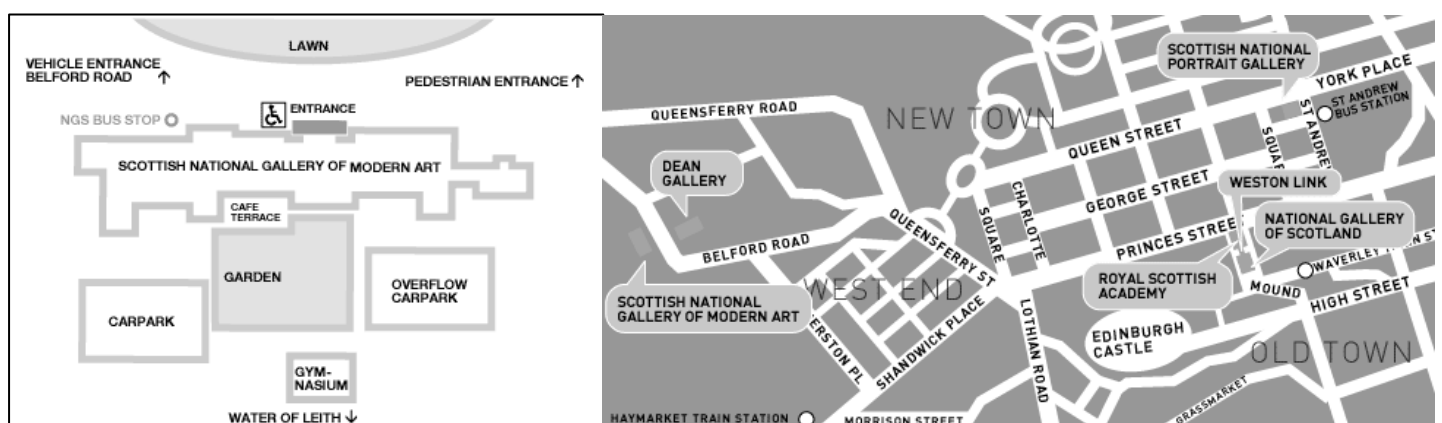
